KING'S LYNN STARS fans are looking forward to what promises to be one of the matches of the season on the morning of May Day, Monday May 6 at eleven o'clock to be precise. Visitors on that day are the re-vamped Coventry Bees, here in League Cup action.

After the excitement of last weekend's triumph against Reading in one of the most exciting matches at Lynn for ages, the Stars are beginning to get into the groove.

The overall impression from around the British League tracks is that virtually every circuit is reporting close, keen competition of a standard never previously witnessed. The concentration of so many top men amongst 11 teams more or less guarantees that.

Coventry, stage-managed by the indestructible Charles Ochiltree for an incredible 38 seasons, have seen and been through most of speedway's post-war ups and downs. What a demonstration of faith in the future though for the Bees to have forked out £45,000 on four new riders in the close season.

Kelvin Tatum (£18,000 from Wimbledon), John Jorgensen (£12,000 from Birmingham), David Bargh (£10,000 from Newcastle) and Frank Andersen (£5,000 from Exeter) were all added to the Brandon brigade during the winter months.

With fit-again Tommy Knudsen, former British champion Steve Bastable and yankee-doodle dandy Rick Miller back for another term, Coventry look to have their most lively team since they won the British League Championship back in 1978 and 1979.

So if you are looking for bank holiday entertainment plus, why not hurry back to see our next meeting at King's Lynn?



What was emphasised once more is that the British League clubs this year are all stacked with class and I'm sure we will be in for a continuing diet of magnificent speedway racing.

What we do most urgently need, apart from some good luck and sunshine, is the continued backing and commitment of those who want King's Lynn Speedway to prosper. Hopefully after last Saturday the word will have spread. It is coming together and there is cause for genuine optimism.

The riders who led the way against the Racers all earned their accolades. Kevin Jolly and Richard Hellsen both seem to thrive upon added responsibility while Dave Jessup's sustained level of performance is a source of further joy.

Steve Regeling began to string together some better races after cursing the loose plug cap which robbed him of victory in the second heat;

BILLY SANDERS

EAST ANGLIA and the speedway world has been saddened by the news of the death of Billy Sanders, for so many seasons an Ipswich stalwart and briefly a King's Lynn rider.

Even in a world where daily headlines almost casually talk of disaster on the grand scale, the loss of one of our own always causes a reaction of shock.

At 29, Billy was, as he had been for the best part of a decade, one of the top riders in the British League and international scene. He had achieved a record number of Australian championship victories, was third in the world in 1980 and runner-up in 1983.

At Ipswich, where he started as a sensational 16 year-old and spent most of his career, punctuated by short spells at Birmingham, Hull and here at Lynn in 1982, Billy piled up thousands of points and played his part in three League titles and numerous other club successes.

At such times, one can only be aware of the inadequacy of words and the fleeting nature of achievement. Rest in peace, Bill.



THIS afternoon is the second stage trail which ultimately leads to the Odsal Stadium, Bradford on August 31 for the 40th Speedway Championship of the World.

A total of 228 different riders representing 15 different nations have ridden in the previous 39. The youngest was Ronnie Moore who was 17 years and 194 days when he made his debut in 1950. Moore's New Zealand fellow countrymen Ivan Mauger and Barry Briggs head the list for the most title wins, the most World Final appearances and the most World Final points respectively.

The youngest Champion was Peter Craven who when winning the 1955 title was 21 years and 86 days old. The most consistent World Finalist was the Swedish 'Fox' Ove Fundin who between 1956 and 1965 failed to finish out of the first three.


