All three have moved into the National League this year and find themselves contesting this early stage of the championship for the first time in many years.


It's an ill wind, though, because their presence alone should guarantee one of the most interesting of quarter final stagings. And the big three cannot expect to have things all their own way.

There will be plenty of home support for Andy Campbell. He clinched his place in Tuesday's



Destruction seems to be so much more in voque than positive efforts at creating something and it's a sad commentary. In the meantime, our stall is set out. King's Lynn Speedway is endeavouring to re-build and rehabilitate itself after some difficult times. If everybody stays with us and all efforts are pointed in the one forward direction, we'll make it.
