




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# King Billy Takes His Third Crown

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NOTE: This report on the Australian Speedway Championship held at the Brisbane Exhibition Grounds on February 21, 1981 was originally published in Revs. The promoters of the Exhibition Speedway sincerely thank Revs Motorcycle News for kindly allowing the article to be reproduced, in a slightly abridged form, here.

BILLY SANDERS is once again king of Australian speedway. But he should exercise his royal discretion and award Bob Hitchcock, of Western Australia, a knighthood for services rendered.

The honour of being crowned Australian Champion — for the second year in succession and the third time in his career — went to Sanders, 25, when he recorded 14 points out of a possible 15 at Brisbane's Exhibition Speedway on February 21.

Second place went to Victoria's Phil Crump who scored 12 points, while equal third on 10 points were John Titman of Queensland, and Danny Kennedy, of Victoria. The run-off for third place went to Titman and so the first three placings are exactly the same as last year's when the national title was held in Sydney.

If any heat could be labelled sensational and decisive it would have to be heat 15. This brought together two of the Big Three of Australian Speedway — Crump and Titman. It was their fourth ride. Sanders had already completed his fourth outing and the Sydneysider had 11 points after dropping a point to Titman in his second start. Crump and Titman had eight points apiece. The Victorian had dropped a point to Sanders in his third heat while Titman had run second to Phil Heme (NSW) in his first outing.

If Crump won heat 15 he would be level on points with Sanders, and Titman's hopes of winning the title would have been very slim indeed with only one race remaining for him. If Titman won, Crump's titles hopes would also appear remote. Surely one of them had to win. After all, Hitchcock had not scored a single point from his first three rides, while Glenn McDonald was experiencing clutch problems and had totalled only one point from his previous three outings.

## BAULKED

When the tapes flew up, Hitchcock led the field away. Going into turn one his back wheel flicked out and he gained an even greater advantage when Titman and Crump were momentarily baulked. What a turn up! Hitchcock in the lead and McDonald holding second place. Crump and then Titman worked their way past McDonald, a hard enough task, but the catching of Hitchcock proved impossible. Even when Hitchcock almost lost it going up the straight on one lap — a tactical manoeuvre according to him — it always appeared as though three laps were not going to be enough for the international stars and the West Australian took the chequered flag in 51.8 seconds — one of the slowest times of the night.

After the meeting Sanders described Hitchcock's ride as 'hairy', while Crump diplomatically stated that Hitchcock had used all the track. If Hitchcock had appreciably helped the cause of Sanders in that most sensational of races, then it was possible he could help Crump out in heat 17. In this race Sanders and

Hitchcock were drawn against each other with Robert Maxfield (SA) and Tim Nunan (Vic) completing the quartet.

Hitchcock again set the crowd buzzing but this time it was because of an exclusion (the only one of the night) for tape breaking. In the re-run, Sanders was the first to jump from the barrier and he went on to win fairly comfortably from Maxfield, who chased him hard without ever really threatening, with Nunan in third place. Sanders waved his left hand in triumph as he took the chequered flag.

## ROOTY HILL ROCKET

The Rooty Hill Rocket was a deserving winner. Four wins and a second were testimony to his class and consistency. However, he was not the favourite prior to the event. While the majority of the crowd wanted to see Titman, the hometown hero, succeed, it was Crump who was seen as the man most likely to win. His form this season had been generally first class and when, after everyone had completed two rides each, he was the only undefeated rider and had also recorded the fastest time of the night to that stage (in fact, his 49.8 in his first race was the fastest time of the night and was the only time under 50.0) his price must have shortened further. Who could have anticipated heat 15?

Gating is all-important in racing at this level and here Sanders excelled. The only time he was headed into the first turn was in his second race when Titman led him all the way. In heat 11 — his vital clash with Crump — Sanders employed plenty of gamesmanship.

On three occasions Sanders rolled into the tapes and each time Crump remained unmoved. When the tapes were finally released Sanders reared but still made good forward progress and was able to force Crump very wide.

Sanders stayed wide, using the grippy parts of the track to good effect. When Crump attempted an inside passing manoeuvre Sanders was able to anticipate this, and although the Victorian tried desperately to bring off an inside pass right at the end, Sanders was always in control.

The track's preparation had been affected by persistent rain in the lead-up to the championship — in fact the title was twice postponed because of rain. It was originally scheduled for February 14 and when that meeting was rained off it was transferred to the following Monday — and down came the rain again. Consequently, the track was vary patchy — plenty of grip on the upper half of the circuit especially, but also some slick spots to make things interesting. If a rider found himself too wide there was a tendency to bog down in the really heavy dirt.

While there was some chopping at the starts, the starting procedure was the best it has been this season for a major bike meeting. The steward, and not the riders, was in control and each rider was able to leave the tapes on even terms with his opponents — if he had the technique and the reflexes.

#### STARTS

Perhaps because his starts weren't always as electrifying and as smooth as they have been in the past, John Titman's prospects suffered.

Crump began so brilliantly with two effortless wins but then recorded three consecutive second placings.

Kennedy always looked an accomplished rider, although he went scoreless in his second ride.

Herne, aboard a Godden, started brightly with a shock win over Titman but apart from that did nothing to suggest he would be on the rostrum. However, he always appeared a certain qualifier for the Australasian Final, as did Kennedy.

There was a three-way tie for sixth place when Gary Guglielmi (NSW), Mick McKeon (WA) and Steve Regeling (Old) all had a score of eight on the points chart.

Following his outstanding performance in winning the Northern Zone Final, also run at the Ekka, Guglielmi could have been expected to earn a higher placing. In the Northern Zone Final he made some excellent gates; in the Australian Final he made some poor gates — and that helps to explain the difference between a 15 point maximum and an eight point return, even allowing for a classier field in the Australian title. When GG did trap better — in the final heat of the night — he won from Crump and McKeon.

#### YOUNGSTER

The Brisbane youngster Regeling continues to impress and his score could have been higher had he not been badly checked by Guglielmi in his third heat. This resulted in Regeling's only scoreless ride of the night.

McKeon was as tigerish as usual but he was the only rider to qualify for the Australasian Final without winning at least one heat.

Possibly the best race of the night was the run-off to determine who would be reserve for the Australasian Final. This featured the four riders who recorded seven points. They were John Boulger (SA), Robert Maxfield (SA), Steve Koppe (Old) and Neil Coddington (Old). The riders finished in the order just stated but the heart-stopping charge into the first bend and the consequent desperate passing that went on suggested the race was for the Australian crown itself.

This was an excellent ride by the veteran Boulger. He also showed in an earlier race when he waged a fascinating duel with Guglielmi that he still possesses toughness, resourcefulness and skill in abundance. Maxfield, who rode so well for Belle Vue in home matches last season, was a solid performer. Coddington started well with seven points from three rides but his next two outings were scoreless and he was forced into the run-off.


#### BUG

Spare a thought for one of the finest sportsmen in speedway — Steve Koppe. His situation was the opposite to Coddington's. He went scoreless in his first two rides and then notched up seven points from his final three outings. His problem — a bug (literally) in the fuel line. When the offending insect was removed Steve's engine started to sound healthy again but the loss of a possible six points was just too much to overcome. Koppe said next time he would include a can of Mortein in his tool box!

Of the others, McDonald had clutch problems, Sansom was stylish but nowhere near quick enough, Nunan recorded a couple of seconds and a lot has already been said about Hitchcock.

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

## **Craig Hodgson - South Australia. Born 8/7/68. Rides for British League Team Bradford.**

Twenty-three year old Craig Hodgson has had a brilliant start to the 1992 season. He won his fourth North Arm Solo Title, his second Kevin O'Connell Memorial, and his third South Australian Solo Championship with a perfect 15-point maximum. Prior to that Craig won the State Title in 1988 and 1989. In 1989 Craig won the Australian Under-21 title at Mildura, and qualified for the World Under-21 Championship at Lonigo in Italy. He scored 5 points to finish in tenth place. The 1988 season was Craig's most successful season in senior speedway. He finished in third place in the Australian Solo Title at Murray Bridge, teamed with Mark Fiora to win the Australian Best Pairs and also winning his second consecutive South Australian title. Craig was the only Australian rider to qualify from the Commonwealth Final to the Overseas Final in 1988. Craig, who is the son of former Australian Test rider Laurie Hodgson (who was so tragically crippled in a racing accident in 1971 at Rowley Park) is also a former South Australian and Australian Individual and Best Pairs Champion in Junior Speedway in the early eighties. Craig is contesting his fourth Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous scores have been - 1987 (10 pts.), 1988 (11 pts., third), 1989 (6 pts.).

## **Mark Carlson - Queensland - Born 24/10/65. Rides for British League Team Oxford.**

Twenty-six year old Mark Carlson qualified for the 1992 Australian Solo Championship, by finishing in second place in the Queensland title. Mark and Troy Butler tied on 14 points a piece, but was beaten in a run-off to decide first place.

Mark began Speedway racing in 1984 after a training school was held at Surfers Paradise which was conducted by Simon Wigg and Peter Ravn.

In 1985 Mark won the International Solo masters at Surfers Paradise and broke Simon Wigg's track record during the same year.

Mark went to England in 1986 and rode for British League Team Oxford for four meetings. He then transferred to National League Team Milton Keynes. He spent the next two seasons with Milton Keynes, before transferring to Stoke in 1990. In 1991 Mark moved to British League Team Oxford. In 1991 Mark broke Simon Wigg's track record at Kingaroy. Mark is making his Australian Title and North Arm Speedway debut tonight.



## **Troy Butler - Queensland. Born 22/9/67. Rode for English National League Team Milton Keynes in 1991.**

Twenty-four year old Troy Butler won his fourth consecutive Queensland Solo Championship at the Brisbane Exhibition Grounds. He defeated Mark Carlson in a run-off to take the title after they both scored 14 points each.

In 1986 Troy became the youngest rider ever to win the Australian Solo Championship. Troy won the 1988 National League Riders Championship in England with a perfect 15 point maximum, and helped British League Team Oxford win the 1985 and 1989 British League Championship.

In 1989 Troy rode in the World Solo Championship at Munich, West Germany. He scored 4 points to finish in twelfth place. Troy rode with English National League team Milton Keynes in 1991, and rumour has it that he wants to move back up to British League in 1992.

Troy is making his seventh consecutive appearance in an Australian Solo Championship. His previous scores have been - 1986 (13 pts, first), 1987 (8 pts), 1988 (10 pts), 1989 (7 pts), 1990 (4 pts), 1991 (4 pts).



## **Mick Poole - New South Wales. Born 27/11/66. Rides for British League Team Poole.**


Twenty-five year old Mick Poole was the surprise winner of this year's New South Wales South Championship at Nepean Speedway with a perfect 15-point maximum. Prior to that Mick's best result was a third place finish in 1987, and fifth place in 1989 and 1990.

In the late eighties Mick helped English team Peterborough win two successive National League Four-team Tournament in 1988 and 1989.

On an individual basis Mick has had a very successful career in England. He has won the Tee Mill Grand Slam Meeting and two Pride of Potteries at Stoke (the only rider ever to win the event twice).

In 1991 Mick moved from National League Team Peterborough to British League Team Poole. He again had a very successful season on an individual basis, winning the Hillside Trophy and the Smith Motors Vauxhall Classic.

Mick is competing in his fourth Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous scores have been - 1987 (9 pts), 1989 (11 pts, fourth), 1990 (9 pts.).



# PROFILES

## Mark Neale

### Leigh Adams, Mildura, Victoria. Born 28/4/71. Rode for British League Team Swindon in 1991.

Twenty-year-old Leigh Adams won his fourth consecutive Victorian Solo Championship at Mildura's Olympic Park Speedway with a perfect 15-point maximum. Leigh was in magnificent form on the 320-metre circuit recording five magnificent wins from five starts. Leigh has won three Australian Under-21 Solo Championships (1988, 1990 and 1991), and is a former Victorian and Australian Individual and Best Pairs Junior Title holder. In 1988 Leigh was the youngest ever Australian champion finalist. He scored 8 points. Leigh qualified for the 1989 World Under-21 Solo championship final at Lonigo, Italy scoring 9 points. He also won the Red Centre 1000 at Alice Springs the same year. Leigh has ridden in the last two Commonwealth and overseas finals in England. The greatest moment of the 1990 season for Leigh Adams, would have been teaming up with Todd Wiltshire to finish in second place in the World Best Pairs Championship. Leigh missed last year's Australian title with a broken wrist. Leigh is contesting his fourth Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous scores have been - 1988 (8 pts), 1989 (6 pts), 1990 (14 points, second).





### Craig Boyce - New South Wales. Born 2/8/67. Rode for British League Team Oxford in 1991.

Twenty-four year old Craig Boyce is the reigning Australian Solo Champion. Craig had a sensational 1991 season winning the "Grand Slam". That is his state title (NSW title), the Australian Best Pairs Championship (with Todd Wiltshire) and the Australian Individual Solo Championship. Craig roared to his first national title win at Arunga Park Speedway, Alice Springs with a perfect 15-point maximum. Craig failed to regain his state title this season, by surprisingly finishing in second place (behind Mick Poole) at Nepean Speedway. He had to defeat Rod Colquhoun in a run-off to take the runner-up position. Craig was out of action for nine weeks with a serious back injury he sustained in the 1991 Commonwealth Final. He was also outed for another three weeks with a broken right foot he sustained in a Swedish league fixture after just two comeback matches (from his back injury) with British League Team Oxford. Craig was a member of the 1991 Australian World Team Cup Squad, and rumour has it that Craig wants to move from Oxford for 1992. Craig is making his third appearance in an Australian solo championship. His previous scores have been - 1989 (10 pts.), 1991 (15 pts, first).

### Kelvin Willis, Northern Territory

Former South Australian Kelvin Willis qualified for his first Australian Championship by finishing in second place in the Northern Territory Solo Title with a total of 14 points. Willis, who was born in Jamestown (South Australia) moved to Alice Springs in 1977, and began his career in 1982.

Willis has won four Centralian Championships (1986, 89, 90, 91). He was runner-up to Glen Baxter in this year's N.T. title and the Red Centre 1000, both held at Alice Springs. Kelvin finished in fifth place in the 1989 Australian Long-track Championship at Port Pirie. He was also reserve for last year's Australian title at Alice Springs. Kelvin is making his Australian title and North Arm Speedway debut tonight.



### Glen Baxter - Northern Territory - Born 15/12/62

Twenty-nine year old Glen Baxter won his third Northern Territory Solo Championship at Arunga Park Speedway with a score of 15 points. Prior to that Glen won the 1988 and 1990 titles. He was runner-up in 1989 and 1991. Glen has won two Mark Nudl Memorials, and won the 1991 Red Centre 1000. In 1988 Glen finished in second place in the Northarm Title (behind Craig Hodgson). Glen, who is the oldest rider in tonight's field is making his fifth consecutive appearance in an Australian Solo Championship. He previous scores have been - 1988 (8 pts), 1989 (6 pts), 1990 (7 pts), 1991 (2 pts).

## Jason Lyons - Victoria - Born 15/6/70. Rides for National League Team Glasgow.

Twenty-one year old Jason Lyons finished in second place in the Victorian Solo Championship at Mildura. It was the second year in a row that Jason has filled the runner-up position to Leigh Adams.

Jason, who has ridden for National League Team Glasgow for the last two seasons, finished in third place in the 1991 World Under 21 Solo Final at Coventry in England.

Jason scooped the major awards at the Glasgow supporters club end of season dinner dance. He surprisingly collected both the 1991 Rider of the Year Trophy and the trophy for the best performances away from home, in only his second season in National League. He was also a member of the Australian World Team Cup squad.


Jason is contesting his second consecutive Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous score has been - 1991 (2 pts.).

## Todd Wiltshire - New South Wales. Born 26/9/68. Rides for British League Team Reading.

Todd Wiltshire made a sensational debut in the 1990 World Solo Championship in Bradford, England, finishing in third place with 12 points. He was only one point adrift of forcing a three-way run-off with Swede Per Johnson and American Shawn Moran.

Todd and Mildura youngster Leigh Adams finished in second place in the 1990 World Pairs Championship in West Germany. Todd won the 1990 New South Wales Solo Championship and in the same year moved up to British league team Reading and helped the Reading Racers to complete the double by winning the Sunbrite British League Competition and the knock-out cup. Last year Todd teamed with Craig Boyce to win an Australian Pairs championship at Alice Springs, and also became the first Australian rider to win the Mr. Melbourne event. Todd who is twenty-three years of age has competed in the last two Commonwealth and overseas finals in England. Todd is competing in his second consecutive Australian title tonight.

He scored 10 points in last year's Australian title to finish in sixth place.



## Michael Carter - Western Australia. Rode for English National League Team Glasgow in 1991.

Former Australian Junior Champion Michael Carter qualified for his first senior Australian title by finishing in second place in the Western Australian Solo Championship. He scored 26 points to finish four points behind history-maker Glenn Doyle.

Michael, who won the 1984 Australian Junior Championship, scored 8 points in the 1989 Australian Under-21 Solo Title at Mildura, and was placed third in the 1991 W.A. Solo Title. Michael rode for national league team Glasgow last year, and his season was cut short by a serious accident, which saw the talented youngster return home to Western Australia. He smashed his ankle which suffered considerable ligament and tendon damage. He spent something like 14 weeks in plaster. Michael is making his North Arm Speedway and Australian title debut tonight.


## Tony Langdon, Queensland. Born 20/6/69. Rides for British League Team Poole.

Tony is making his Australian title debut tonight.




# PROFILES

## Mark Neale

### Shane Parker, South Australia. Born 29/4/70. Rides for British League Team Ipswich.

Twenty-one year old flamboyant South Australian Shane Parker qualified for his fourth consecutive national title by finishing in second place in the South Australian Solo Championship with a score of 14 points. Shane, who was the defending South Australian title holder was runner-up to Craig Hodgson in the South Aussie title, the North Arm solo title and the Kevin O'Connell Memorial this season. Shane (who was a former South Australian and Australian Junior Champ) won the S.A. title in 1991 and was runner-up in 1990 and 92, and was placed third in 1989. He has won two S.A. Best Pairs titles, and has finished in second place (1991) and third place (1990) in Australian Under-21 Solo Championships. A crash involving Victorian Jason Lyons in the 1991 World Under-21 Solo Championship Final at Coventry in England almost certainly cost Shane victory in the event. He was undefeated at the time of the crash, which saw him go through the fence wrecking his number one bike. He scored 10 points to finish in fourth place. Shane finished in fifth place in the 1990 World Under-21 Solo Championship Final at Lvov in Russia with 9 points. Shane is contesting his fourth consecutive Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous scores have been - 1989 (2 pts.), 1990 (5 pts.), 1991 (8 pts.).



### Glenn Doyle - Western Australia. Born 4/3/65. Rides for British League Team Bradford.


Twenty-six year old Glenn Doyle is Western Australia's only dual Australian Champion having won the 1989 (Newcastle Motordrome) and 1990 (Brisbane Exhibition Ground) Australian titles. Glenn won his fourth consecutive Western Australian Solo Champion at Claremont Speedway in December 1991. He created history in Western Australia by winning four consecutive state titles. Glenn and South Australia's Craig Hodgson were members of the Bradford Coalites Dukes in England which won both the Knock-Out Cup (against Poole) and defeating Poole in the B.S.P.A. Cup. Bradford finished in second place in the First Division League. Glenn has ridden in the last three Commonwealth finals in England, and rode in the 1991 Overseas Final. He was a member of the 1991 Australian World Team Cup squad and won the 1991 Aub Lawson Medal. Glenn was top point scorer for Australia in the 1991 World Pairs Qualifying round in Czechoslovakia and won the 1991 Coalite Classic in England. Glenn is making his fifth successive appearance in an Australian Solo Championship tonight. His previous scores have been - 1988 (4 pts), 1989 (13 pts, first), 1990 (14 pts, first), 1991 (14 pts, second).

### Rodney Colquhoun, New South Wales

Wollongong Rocket Rodney Colquhoun finished in third place in the New South Wales Solo Championship at Nepean Speedway with a score of 13 points. Rodney and Craig Boyce tied on 13 points a piece, but was beaten in a run-off to decide second place.

Rod finished in third place in the 1990 Australia Day Gold Cup meeting at Parramatta Speedway and in the same year scored 9 points to finish in sixth place in the New South Wales title.

Rod has ridden for English teams Poole and Swindon. He is making his North Arm Speedway and Australian Title debut tonight.



### David Cheshire - Western Australia, 25 years old, rode for English National League Team Middlesbrough in 1991.

David Cheshire is Western Australia's youngest ever state champion. he won the 1984 title at seventeen years of age.

David, who won three state junior championships, rode in the 1986 World Under-21 Solo Championship final in Russia and represented Australia in the World Team Cup in the same year.

David finished in fourth place in last year's Australian title at Alice Springs and teamed with Glenn Doyle to take third place in the pair's title as well.

David, who is twenty-five years old, finished in fifth place in the Western Australian solo title this season, was seeded into tonight's title.

He is competing in his fifth Australian championship tonight, and his previous scores have been:- 1984 (4 pts), 1986 (4 pts), 1987 (6 pts), 1991 (10 points, fourth).

## **Steven Graetz, South Australia. Born 11/6/73. Reserve.**

Seventeen-year-old Steve Graetz is currently in his third season of senior speedway. Steven has won the last two North Arm B-grade Solo Championship Finals in great style. Steven has had great success both on and off the track in his two full seasons of senior speedway. In 1990 Steven won the Rookie of the Year award at North Arm and Murray Bridge, as well as winning the B-grade title.

Last year Steven scored 8 points in the State title and was placed fifth in the North Arm title and the Kevin O'Connell Memorial. Off the track he collected a number of trophies at the end of season presentation nights.


Paul scored a creditable 7 points in the 1990 Australian Under-21 Solo Championship at Renmark Speedway (which was won by Leigh Adams).



*Reigning Australian Pairs Champions Craig Boyce (left) and Todd Wiltshire (right) in action.*



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

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# RIDER'S OF THE

## **John Boulger; Born 8/6/45. Won Nine South Australian Solo Championships.**

John Boulger is without doubt one of the greatest Solo Riders ever to come from South Australia. John won nine South Australian Solo Championships, with seven of them in succession. In what has to be a record (in any State), John finished on the rostrum in the South Australia Solo Title for fourteen successive years. He won the South Australian Title in 1970, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78 and 82. He finished in second place in 1969 and 80, and was placed third in 1971, 79 and 81.

## **Mark Fiora: Won Four South Australian Solo Championships.**

Mark Fiora began his speedway career in 1980. He won the South Australian Solo Championship on four occasions – 1983, 84, 85, 87 and was runner-up three times 1986, 88, 89.

Mark competed in eight Australian Solo Championship final 1982, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88 and 89, with his best result being at Pioneer Park (1985) and Murray Bridge (1988), both finishing in fourth place.

Mark won the 1988 Australian Pairs Championship (with Craig Hodgson) at Murray Bridge) and also won the 1989 Kevin O'Connell Memorial.

Mark rode for National League Team Middlesborough in England.

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# PAST PROFILES

## **Rob Jarvis: Born 11/12/57.**

Rob Jarvis began his speedway career in 1975 and retired in 1988. Prior to that he rode short circuit and motor cross.

In those thirteen seasons of racing Rob won three Riverland Solo Titles, and won six highest Country Point Score Awards in a row. Rob won the highest Murray Bridge point score award in 11 out of the 13 years he competed in.

The popular rider, who mainly rode on country tracks won one Murray Bridge Solo Title and was runner-up on five occasions.

His best performance in a South Australian Solo Title was in 1983 at Speedway Park when he finished in fifth place.


Rob represented South Australia in teams meeting at Darwin and Alice Springs, and certainly should have gone to England to ride full time in his earlier years.

## **Brenton Langlios: Born 30/9/48.**

Brenton Langlios is a man with many talents. Brenton was a top line solo rider before being one of South Australia's Best Sidecar passengers.

Brenton began his speedway career at 21 years of age and was a star both here in Australia and overseas. He won the 1977 Australian long Track Title and three years earlier in 1974 he won the South Australian Long track Title. He also won 3 Riverland Solo Titles in a row, three highest point score awards at Renmark, and won one Murray Bridge Solo Title.

In England Brenton rode for Bradford in 1973 and 75. In 1975 he teamed with Alan Knapkin to win the Charlie Williams Division Two Championship.

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
