

## "SPEEDWAY STAR'S" DICK BARRIE

Hello again! Getting back into the swing of things now, although after our season of Sundays last year is seemed mighty strange to be back on the road on Saturday last week! Not that I mind — all things being equal, I think I prefer Saturday-nighting to Sabbath speedway for my regular shot of Shielfield shale-shifting — while Sundays can still be very good indeed for special occasions.

Talking of special occasions, next Saturday is of course Easter Saturday — and with it comes our first visit of the year from those ranting, raving fans from Glasgow! What memories of Saturday Night Fever in the past their visits can conjure up!

The Tigers have, over the seasons we've known them since they joined our level of racing in 1974, without doubt provided the most consistent level of spirited opposition that I can recall. That much of this excitement is due to their travelling band of camp-followers, each ready to sing, shout and scream themselves absolutely hoarse in an effort to exhort their beloved Tigers on to greater things, is undeniable. I'm not really in favour of mixing sport with politics, but I thought that someone should stand up and point this fact out — and if I don't, nobody else seems likely to do so.

Coming back to this evening's racing, I'm always pleased to watch a World Championship round — mainly, I suppose, because the title is still the prize in speedway. Sure, it would be a massive sensation if any of the boys we'll be watching in action tonight get all the way to Poland in September. But the fact remains that they're getting a chance to do so — and that's what's so important! To each and every competitor tonight, I wish you well. You will progress (well, some of you will!) on to other, higher, levels of World Championship racing from tonight's meeting — and I hope you carry our National League flag high as you do so. Good Luck to you all!

To everyone else — just enjoy your speedway, see you again for all our Easter fun'n'games next Saturday — until then, be lucky!


